International Women's day

The world woke up today, March 8th, with the commemoration of Women's Day in a pandemic that has affected all the countries. This day commemorates the struggle for gender equality for all people, regardless of whether they are men or women, and also recognizes the great influence and work of women throughout history because of the low recognition it has.

Today, the world celebrated with the usual celebrations and demonstrations except in different countries like Spain, where the government prohibited the demonstrations in Madrid due to the actual Covid-19 emergency. In other countries, feminists and other people that support the women's movement comes to the main meeting place with the necessary measures to reject outright gender violence.

All types of violence against girls and women have increased since the Covid-19 state of emergency initiated, according to a publication by the UN Women. But that's not the only threat: the pandemic has put them on the ropes in the face of job loss, school dropouts and risk of different mental problems. These problems are generally found around the world, but those are not the unique problems that affect women: unemployment rate and the salary difference were some of the most important points.

Concern

In Latin-America and the Caribbean, 18 million women could lose access to contraceptives which leads to a higher rate of teenage pregnancies, sexually transmitted diseases (ITS) and maternal mortality, being one of the worst problems of gender inequality in these 2 continents.

The United Nations Population Fund has said: "there will be 7 million unintended pregnancies for every 6 months of extended confinement and 2 million women unable to use modern contraceptives for every 3 months of confinement."

Feminist economy

The Center for Argentine Political Economy (CEPA) published a report on Monday within the framework of Women's Day that reported the worsening of gender gaps during the pandemic. The increase in unpaid work.

Prince Philip of Edinburgh dies at the age of 99

The event

Philip of Edinburgh, better known as the Prince of Edinburgh, has recently died on the morning of April 8th, on the Windsor Castle, Windsor, UK. Queen Isabel's husband was caught on camera recently in a deplorable state of health, after having been admitted to the hospital for heart surgery last march.

Royal VIPs and close associates have mourned his death after the royal family's statement at 11:30 a.m. Following the death of Prince Philip, there is much uncertainty about what's next for the royal family.

Why was he important?

He was born on June 10, 1921 in the Mon Repos village in Corfu, a Greek island in the Ionian Sea. On November 20, 1947, Felipe married the heir to the British throne, Princess Elizabeth. Felipe had four children: Charles, Anna, Andrew and Edward; plus, eight grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren. Married for more than 70 years to Queen Elizabeth, the controversial Philip of Edinburgh made more than 22,191 official engagements and other activities. In 2017 he retired from public office until his death.

The duke had been admitted for the last time to the hospital in December 2020, for four nights, on the advice of his doctor as a precautionary measure due to a "pre-existing condition". He was discharged on Christmas Eve.

Coronavirus: A year from the pandemic statement about Covid-19

A year ago, the coronavirus in China was discovered and with the pass of the days, it spread all over the world, which made 2020 one of the worst years in history for many. Nowadays, vaccines are being distributed to all countries to finish the actual Covid-19 pandemic. How was the coronavirus created? According to scientists at the University of Oxford, they affirm that the coronavirus came from bats thanks to a study of the genomic sequences of SARS-CoV-2, a variant of the original coronavirus. However, the current epidemic is spreading very quickly which makes it difficult to have an up-to-date compilation of all the data that has come out about the virus. The scientific and medical community has already been able to isolate it, sequence it and identify it. The main events related to Covid-19 from this last month are: **Covishield and Covaxin vaccines** to several countries.

The Indian vaccines Covashield and Covaxin have been approved by the Argentine government amid a state of emergency due to high infection rates in that nation, after being described as a promising vaccine that "meets the standards required to be safe," according to researchers. This is one of the new hopeful vaccines that have come on the market, and one of those that have been in high demand in Mexico and Brazil and of course Argentina. **Several countries suspended vaccination of AstraZeneca's vaccine.** Eleven countries in the world have suspended vaccination with AstraZeneca after detecting cases of severe thrombi. Andalusia and Asturias have retained doses of the affected batch. AstraZeneca vaccine setbacks in Denmark, Norway and Iceland at least for now until investigations are complete.

These three countries have decided to temporarily suspend vaccination with doses of AstraZeneca after registering "severe cases of thrombi" in people who had already been inoculated with the vaccine. WHO and China agree to search for first Covid-19 cases. After 120 million people have been infected in the world to date by Covid-19, the WHO and the China government made several agreements to search for the first cases of covid-19 in the world in December 2019, or even earlier. This event is programmed to be solved during the next months of 2021. Asymptomatic cases in china As for the asymptomatic infected, China added 25 new positives in this latest report, all of them imported, which puts the total number of people under observation in these circumstances at 397, of which all but one come from abroad. Likewise, the health authorities detailed that, until last local midnight, 7 patients were discharged, so the total number of active infected in mainland China is 173. In total, 80,484 people have recovered from COVID -19 in China, while 6,233 people remain under medical observation after maintaining close contact with someone infected

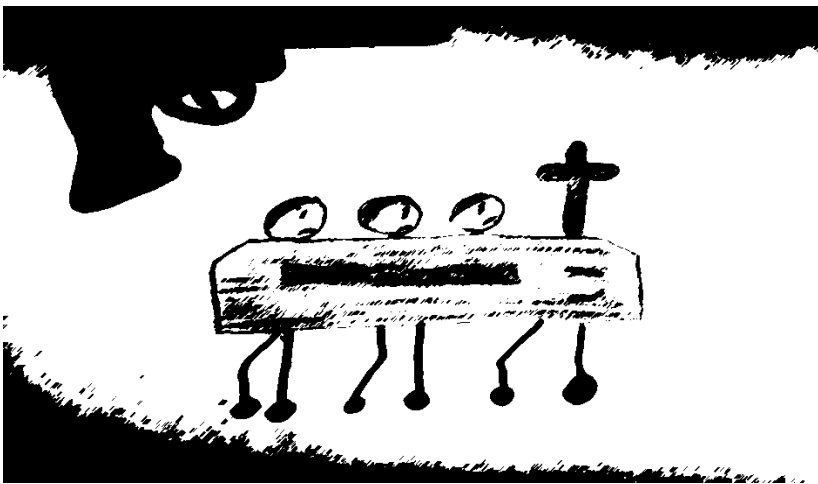

Massacre in Catatumbo: five dead and five wounded in Ábrego attack

Colombia's violence history, ongoing for more than 50 years has not ceased.

This Sunday March 7th, at 9:39 pm Armed men arrived at a pool hall in the area of Santander, when they undertook an attack against 10 people who were in the establishment, this is the 16th massacre that goes on this year 2021. The authorities of the department confirmed that the crime was committed with firearms (they did not specify which ones), the attack occurred after the individuals left the establishment in the municipality of Abrego, in the Catatumbo region. Witnesses affirm that 2 individuals arrived on a motorcycle with the intention of attacking the lives of 10 people, according to Coronel Carlos Martínez *"The Army and the Police have already moved to the place and are carrying out intelligence work to clarify the facts of the attack.* The victims were identified as Winston Prada Puentes, Heimer Ortiz Ballesteros, José Luis Vega Plata, Jesús Alberto Vega y Robinson Garay Barbosa.

The Eln guerrillas, the Pelusos and the Residual Organized Armed Group, GAO 33, are active in the area. Although Ivan Duque, president of Colombia, affirms that in our departments there are no massacres but collective murders, after this the president assured: *"in our government, which has been in power for two years, these facts have also been presented, there have been 37 'collective homicides', which are equivalent to 2 percent of the 'collective homicides' of the last 22 years".* Likewise, he stated that the killings have left 7,458 victims.

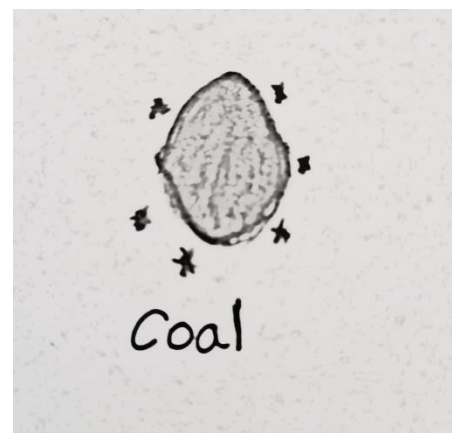
As a result of these events, counting those of the last hours, 188 people have died, which is equivalent to 22 percent of the victims of collective homicides in the last 22 years.

Opinion: Peace in Colombia will only be obtained by making territories like El Catatumbo, and their situation visible for the rest of the country. Also, it's necessary that the government makes peace a main goal for Colombia.

National coal operation already on China's radar

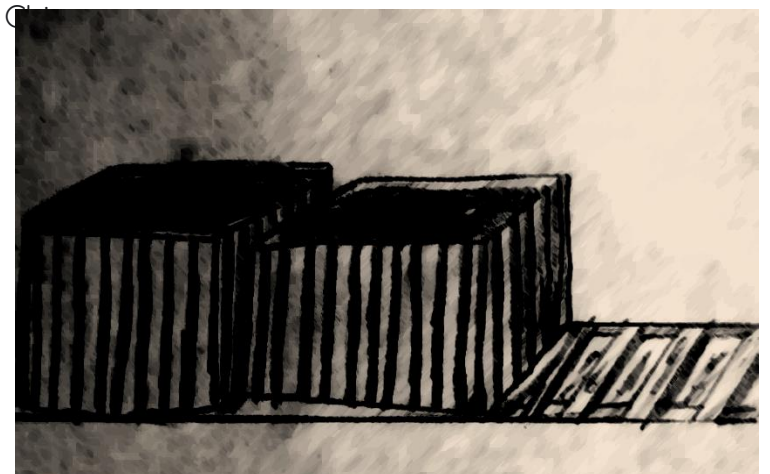

This news was announced by the Minister of Mines and Energy, Diego Mesa, is directed towards the Bloomberg news agency. This managed to affirm that the appreciated mineral was quite important for a country like China. The agency confirmed that the coal companies of that country have already promised to fulfill the task set by Prodeco.

The intentions that China has regarding the importation of coal produced from La Guajira (Colombia) is to have control of the coal companies and thus reduce the demand for the material in their country, has gone hand in hand with its recent announcement, this in order to avoid the shortage of coal supply, which made them have to increase their imports.

Also, to take over all of Prodeco's business. They are waiting for changes in the CNR situation. Its name is adjacent to the name of the Glencore subsidiary and it's currently subject to Business Restructuring.

In conclusion, they will bet on maintaining Cerrejón's operations. Today, two of its three partners, BHP Billiton and Anglo American, are trading stocks with

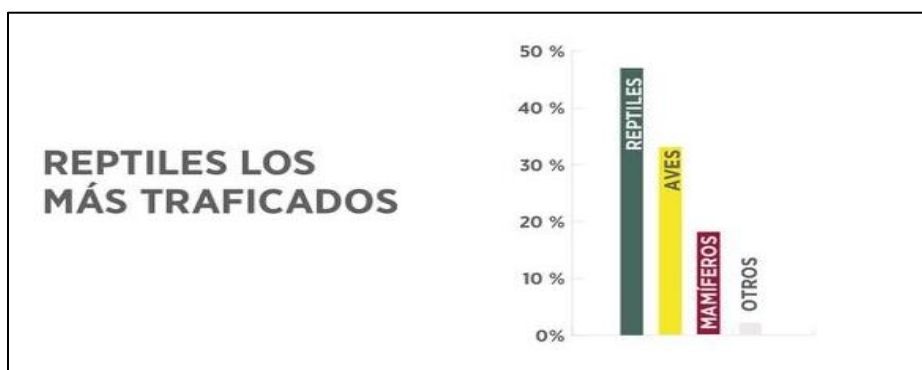
During this pandemic, the animal traffic increased, we think that the pandemic benefits the animals and not the humans, but both of them have difficult problems.

In 2020, not only humans were affected by the pandemic. Thousands of wild animals that were captured from their natural ecosystems to be trafficked illegally also suffered serious consequences.

Here in Colombia, the most traffic animals are birds, like: (Gold Button, Pihuichos, Parrot, Macaws) and primates (Monkey, friar, wooly, marmoset) and reptiles like turtles and iguanas.

In Colombia, which is a country very rich in biodiversity, during the first year of the pandemic there was an increase of 42% in the reception of wildlife in the centers of the Regional Autonomous Corporations.

The consequences of animal trafficking can cover several areas. Habitat destruction and the loss of the world's biodiversity are the most important. This destruction also leads to the extinction of native flora and fauna, altering any life cycle.

COLOMBIA DISCOVERS THREE TYPES OF NEW ORCHIDS

The national flower has 3 new species

Orchids (scientific name Orchidaceae) are a family of monocotyledonous plants that are distinguished by the complexity of their flowers and by their ecological interactions by pollinating agents and with the fungi with which they form mycorrhizae.

Orchids developed modifications that allow them to capture and store water. The roots of epiphytic species are exposed to air and susceptible to desiccation. Epiphytic orchids developed a very strong tissue called canopy that covers the surface of the root, which helps conserve the water.

In the ninth century, the L. Fuchs, a German botanist, describes the orchids in the extensive treatise Historia stirpium. In the same period

The first tropical orchids arrived in Europe from the West Indies thanks to Francisco Hernandez, a Jesuit priest.

Phalaenopsis as we say in this headline of this post itself, the most popular type of orchid: Dendrobium (another of the most common orchid species for those who have already started in the world of orchids.)

Here in Colombia in the: Parques Nacionales Naturales Munchique and Farallones de Cali, people discover 3 new types of orchids that are: the *Epidendrum acuminatisepalum*, the *Epidendrum aurimurinus* and the *Epidendrum medusichilum*.

NEW LAW AGAINST DEFORESTERS

Deforesters could face jail up to 12 years

The penalty for the ones who commit this crime against nature, the sentence will increase when the behavior is carried out for the purpose of illegal expansion of the agricultural frontier, livestock in prohibited areas, land grabbing, crops for illicit use, exploration and illicit exploitation of minerals, the improvement or construction of illegal infrastructure and also if more than 30 contiguous hectares of extension are affected.

The same article also punishes the promotion and financing of deforestation. "Anyone who promotes, finances, directs, facilitates, supplies means, takes advantage of economically or obtains any other benefit from the felling, burning, cutting, uprooting or destruction of areas equal to or greater than one continuous or discontinuous hectare of natural forest or mangrove", will incur in prison from ninety-six 96 to 180 months and a fine of 300 to 50,000 minimum legal monthly wages.

Article 336 also refers to the invasion of areas of special ecological importance, one of the main causes of deforestation in the country. The classification of this crime indicates that whoever "invades, remains so temporarily or makes improper use of the natural resources referred to in this title in a forest reserve area, ecosystems of ecological importance, beaches, low tide lands, shelters or indigenous reserves, lands of collective property of the black communities, regional park, natural national park, area or ecosystem of strategic interest, protected area, defined in the law" will have to pay 48 to 144 months in jail and a fine of, for less, 134 minimum wages.

Opinion: We need to protect the environment, don't deforest the trees that are our main source for oxygen. And now, this has a law punishment: you would be in jail.

The first domestic robots in the USA with Alexa

The American company for e-commerce and cloud computing services at all levels based in the American city of Seattle, Washington State; Amazon is one of the leaders in the commercialization of a robotic device for home use called Vesta moves around different places and performs work more efficiently.

Vesta's main functions are the solution of problems inside homes, responding to orders from human beings, interacting with other smart devices, among other functions.

It is not the first device that Amazon has created, although very little has been known, it can be said that Eco and Alexa are like speakers and were among the first that have been developed as a Robot Assistant.

This project consists of a screen, cameras, microphone and Alexa, one of the most used voice assistants in the world, it is also known that 800 people work for the creation of this device and preparing with engineers specialized in robotics and training them to support technical information to future Vesta users.

It has been known that Vesta is the size of two small cats and is described as "a tablet with wheels" that can be moved around the house by means of voice commands.

Among the great challenges is the small interest that Vesta can create before a small number of users knowing the great effort that has been made to develop this project. Due to this, a high price has been projected and costs have been reduced, such as the transfer of production to Mexico, which has led to quality problems and delayed the final launch.

It is intended that this device be an assistant for the home and can facilitate the daily tasks of the house and that it generates a great impact in the market in which it can compete with an accessible price for all the public and an efficient device for its users.

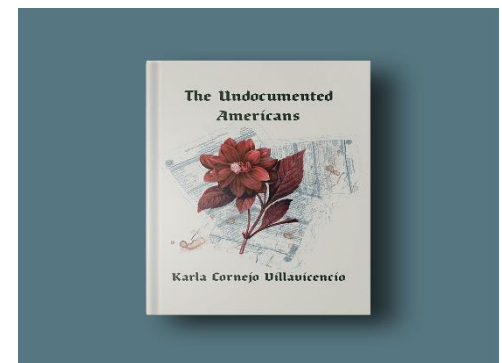
"Nuestra parte de noche", by Mariana Enríquez

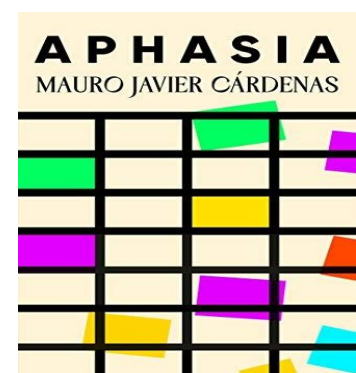
"En la tierra somos fugazmente hermosos", by Ocean Vuong
